

10 reasons the Affordable Care Act is good for Michigan

- 1 Michigan's uninsured rate has dropped by 45% under the Affordable Care Act.
 - Over <u>600,000</u> working individuals with low incomes were able to gain health insurance, many for the first time, through Michigan's Healthy Michigan Plan (Medicaid expansion).
 - Nearly 3.5 million Michiganians (including 977,000 children) saw lifetime coverage limits disappear as a result of the Affordable Care Act's ban on lifetime limits.
 - Michigan residents have received <u>\$91.8 million</u> in refunds from plans that overcharged for premiums since the ACA took effect.
 - 4.4 million Michiganians with pre-existing conditions including cancer, asthma and diabetes who were often denied healthcare have been able to gain necessary health coverage.
 - An analysis done at the University of Michigan shows that the implementation of Medicaid expansion has resulted in more than 30,000 new jobs every year.
 - Prior to the Affordable Care Act, women were charged approximately 32% more for health coverage than men. Now they are charged the same.
 - **8** A result of a provision that requires health plans to allow those up to the age of 26 to stay on their parents' health insurance policies.
 - Mental health parity has provided coverage for those suffering from mental illness and substance use disorder, including opioid addiction.
- 200,000 senior citizens and people with disabilities have saved an average of \$1,000 each in prescription drug costs.
